Matthew Michael Brown is Director of Music and Organist at First United Methodist Church of Salisbury, North Carolina, where his responsibilities include overseeing the Stanback Department of Sacred Music and serving as Artistic Director of the FirstARTS Concert Series. Mr. Brown has been a guest artist for series and festivals in Westminster Abbey and St. Paul's Cathedral, London; Barcelona Cathedral, Spain; Washington National Cathedral; Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue, New York; Princeton University Chapel; Assembly Hall of the Mormon Tabernacle; Trinity Church on Copley Square, Boston; Grace Church Cathedral, Charleston; and the Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta.

He is a graduate of the North Carolina School of the Arts and holds the Master of Music degree in Organ Performance & Literature and the Sacred Music Diploma from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. A grant recipient from The Robert Carwithen Foundation, he continued private organ studies for two years in the United States and abroad with Dame Gillian Weir. Other former teachers include David Higgs, Jack Mitchener, Wayne Leupold, and improvisation with William Porter.

Mr. Brown served as Dean of the Charlotte Chapter of the American Guild of Organists from 2014-2017. He is currently the Course Manager for the Royal School of Church Music Carolina Course at Duke University and enjoys serving on the board of directors for several charitable organizations in his community.

The Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

The brief Liturgy of reverence provides the faithful with an opportunity to pause and acknowledge the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. It had its origin in the extended devotion of the faithful to the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic Gifts and in the practice of concluding extra liturgical times of prayer by blessing the assembled with the consecrated Bread of the Eucharist. This afternoon Benediction is provided by the use of the blessed Priest's Host in a monstrance. The gift of any sacrament is for the spiritual and physical benefit of the Lord's people. Benediction does not take the place of receiving Communion but it helps create a quiet space where we may be still and know that the Lord is God. It also extends a Eucharistic blessing on all who are assembled.

All kneeling, the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance is exposed; then the following hymn is sung by the Choir.

O salutaris O saving Victim

After a period of silent adoration of the Sacrament, the following hymn is sung by the Choir.

Let us pray: O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament has left us a perpetual Memorial of Thy Passion: Grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the Sacred Mysteries of Thy Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within ourselves the fruit of Thy redemption; who livest and reignest, world without end.

Amen.

The Officiant then goes to the altar and with the Monstrance makes the sign of the Cross over the people as the thurifer censes the Blessed Sacrament and the server rings the bell. The people may make the sign of the Cross and bow in adoration, saying silently

Blesséd, praised and adored be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament.

The Monstrance is placed on the Altar and the Divine Praises are said, all kneeling.

Each phrase is said first by the Officiant and repeated by the people.

Blesséd be God.

Blesséd be His Holy Name.

Blesséd be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blesséd be the Name of Jesus.

Blesséd be His Most Sacred Heart.

Blesséd be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blesséd be God the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.

Blesséd be the Great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blesséd be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blesséd be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

The Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle.

The people stand.
