ST. GEORGE'S BAGHDAD RESPONDS TO CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL'S SUPPORT

As our mission support of Iraq's sole Anglican church continues, Father Faiz Jerjees of St. George's in Baghdad has responded with a message (translated from Arabic) to Christ Church Cathedral: "I would like to show my gratitude for all the prayers risen to God for our Church in Baghdad. Because of you feel we are not forgotten even with all the challenges and hesitation in the country ... also I would like to send my greetings to you and pass my church greetings and let you know that we are praying for you." Father Faiz further reports: "Recently we started The Redeemer primary school after hard cooperative efforts. The school can host up to 300 [children] from different religions and ethnic groups; our doors are opened to everyone. The Redeemer ... is run by the church and the main goal is raising a generation properly far from violence culture; the other goal is to generate job opportunities for Christians." He adds that Christ Church Cathedral's support is helping the community "in very practical way through the kindergarten, clinic, school and other activities." The Grants Committee recently approved a \$5,000 grant through FRRME, the Foundation for Relief and Reconciliation in the Mideast, to support destitute families at St. George's.


