MEET THE NOMINEES



JOHN BRIDGES

John has been a parishioner at Christ Church Cathedral for 38 years and has served on the Vestry twice before. He coordinates ushers for the 11 a.m. Liturgy, as well as for other special liturgies, and also serves as transportation coordinator for Room In The Inn. He is a lector and is regularly involved in Annual Campaigns and the planning of Cathedral celebrations. Career-wise, John spent 10 years writing about music at the *Tennessean* and another 10 years as a senior editor at the *Nashville Scene*. He was fundraiser for Mayor Bill Purcell and served as director of cultural affairs in Purcell's administration. He has served on the boards of Nashville CARES and Planned Parenthood of Middle Tennessee, and is a member of the advisory boards of Tennessee Justice Center, Nashville Opera, and Young Democrats of Tennessee. He created Artrageous, the fundraiser for Nashville CARES that has raised more than \$3 million for that agency. He is the author of best-selling books about manners for men.



ELISE DUGGER

Elise has attended Christ Church Cathedral since 2012. She is a member of the Wedding Guild and Guild of the Christ Child. She has been active with the Young Adults Ministry, volunteered for Discovery Weekend, and served as a member of the Occasional Liturgies Committee, which launched BreakingBread@6. She also coordinated volunteers for the Diocesan Convention when it met at the Cathedral and was a member of the DuBose Conference Center board of directors. Elise holds an undergraduate degree in theology from Georgetown University and a Master of Arts in religion from Yale Divinity School. She is currently associate director of the YMCA Center for Civic Engagement. Elise and her husband Nathan live in Nashville with their two labs, Luna and Sirius.



DAVID HANSEN

David has been an active member of Christ Church Cathedral since 1987. He reaffirmed his baptismal vows after attending the first offered Catechumenate class. David has served on the Vestry previously, where he was the liaison for Christian Formation and was on the organist-choirmaster search committee responsible for recruiting Michael Velting. For more than a decade, David has participated as a lector. His four adult children grew up at Christ Church and were active in the youth group and choir. He now has two grandchildren who participate in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. David is on the faculty at Vanderbilt University Medical Center as a clinical cardiologist and teacher, and has enjoyed a productive research career. He is an accomplished pianist and composer, who has contributed three anthems for the Christ Church Choristers and composed original music for all four of his children's weddings.



JILL FARRINGER MEESE

A Nashville native and graduate of Harpeth Hall and Vanderbilt, Jill joined Christ Church in 1976, two years prior to moving to Texas for her first career. She and her husband Brad returned to Nashville in 2006. She is retired from operational strategy and planning at Covance, Inc. Jill has been a lector and has served on the Finance Committee since 2010. She chaired the 2018 Pledge Drive and co-chaired the 2018 Women's Retreat. Jill has served on the Parish Life Commission and is a member of the Strategic Plan Implementation Finance Workgroup. She is also currently serving as stewardship liaison on the Capital Campaign Committee. She founded the Sunday Solos fellowship group in 2016. In addition to her Christ Church Cathedral activities, Jill is a volunteer at the Nashville Food Project, serves on the board of the Metro Historical Commission Foundation, and is a member of the Herb Society of Nashville.
