RITE OF RECONCILIATION

The third graders in our parish who come to Catechesis of the Good Shepherd on Sunday mornings have a special opportunity to grow in grace. They will come together over five Sundays to read and meditate on particular scriptures and to pray for themselves and others. They will read and then discuss Jesus's parables of love, forgiveness, and joy. During a day-long retreat at the end of the five weeks, they will



each talk with a priest about where in their lives they haven't used the gifts that have been given them and what gifts they have used well. They will have the opportunity to say "I'm sorry" and to be changed by Jesus's love. This love shown to us by Jesus is expressed through the priest as an absolution. This is formally called "The Reconciliation of a Penitent in the Book of Common Prayer. At the Eucharist on that day, they will celebrate with Jesus and with each other the forgiveness of those sins.

There are two gifts that we look at during these weeks together: confession and communion. God created an amazing world and then when we fell short, He sent Jesus to redeem us, to make it right again. Anyone can tell you where they have fallen short, not made the right choices, allowed evil and sin to grow. Our world and each of us individually have been given numerous gifts. We often do not use these gifts as we should; sometimes we do not use them at all. Being able to say "I'm sorry" is a great relief. Saying this in the context of Jesus's abiding love and care is truly wonderful. It is a form of saying "thank you" for the gifts we have been given. Coming together to share the Eucharist, to be in communion with Jesus and each other, is a joyous occasion.

Starting today, please pray for this year's class of third graders, their families, our priests, and the catechists joining with them in this process.



WEAPONS INTO PLOWSHARES SHANE CLAIRBORNE AND MICHAEL MARTIN FRIDAY, MARCH 15 | 6:00 p.m. | Nave

On Friday, March 15, from 6 to 8 p.m. the Cathedral will welcome Shane Claiborne and Mike Martin as part of their 38-city Beating Guns tour. During the event, Mike, a Mennonite pastor turned blacksmith, will turn a gun into a garden tool on a forge set up in the parking lot, in a demonstration of the words of the prophet Isaiah: "and they shall beat their swords into plowshares." (Isaiah 2:4)



The evening will include music and a discussion of the spiritual dynamics of a culture of fear and violence. Attendees will have an opportunity to write the hostilities of their hearts on pieces of paper and then burn them in the forge. Shane will present ideas for ways to address the epidemic of gun violence in America and will eventually be joined by Mike, who will present the tool he has made and give it away. The evening will conclude with a "benediction" in which Shane and Mike will send attendees out to live into the prophet Isaiah's message. Afterward, Shane and Mike will be available to sign copies of their book *Beating Guns: Hope for People Who Are Weary of Violence*.
