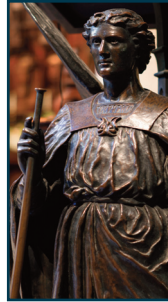

SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER

MARCH 5 | 5:00 P.M. | CHEEK HALL

It's back! Come for pancakes and fellowship at the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on March 5. Win Bassett and his crew will show their pancake-flipping prowess at this traditional evening of pre-fasting indulgence. Celebrated the day before Ash Wednesday, Shrove Tuesday (also called "Pancake Tuesday" or "Pancake Day") is the final day before the 40-day period of Lent begins. Shrove Tuesday also became a day to *laissez les bons temps rouler* before beginning a Lenten discipline. In particular, the need to use up rich ingredients such as butter, milk, sugar, and eggs before Lent gave rise to the tradition of eating pancakes on this day. Join us for this fun event!



ASH WEDNESDAY

MARCH 6 | 7:00 A.M., 12:15 P.M., AND 6:00 P.M. | NAVE

During the Ash Wednesday Liturgy, the foreheads of worshippers are marked with an ashen cross. Being marked with a cross symbolizes that the person belongs to God. This is in imitation of the mark with chrism that is put on in baptism, when we are "marked as Christ's own forever." The ashes are traditionally made from palm fronds from the previous year's Palm Sunday observance.

NOAH LISTENING PROJECT

TODAY THROUGH APRIL 14

To help NOAH determine what is currently important to its organizational members, NOAH is inaugurating a Listening Project. From March 3 to April 14, a trained team of about 12 volunteers from Christ Church Cathedral will each interview 6-12 members of the parish to hear life stories, struggles, and concerns for themselves, their families, our congregation, and the community. The community issues that are identified in these interviews will be reported to NOAH. On June 2, NOAH will have an Issues Convention and vote to determine the foci of NOAH going forward. In addition, the deeper relationships that we build between members will strengthen our congregation.

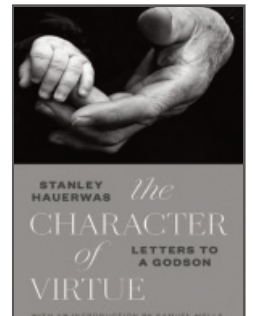

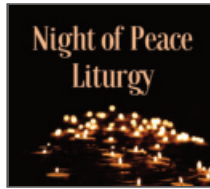

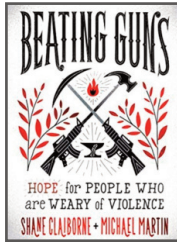

WEAPONS INTO PLOWSHARES SHANE CLAIBORNE AND MICHAEL MARTIN FRIDAY, MARCH 15 | 6:00 P.M. | NAVE

On Friday, March 15, from 6 to 8 p.m., the Cathedral will welcome Shane Claiborne and Mike Martin as part of their 38-city Beating Guns tour. During the event, Mike, a Mennonite pastor turned blacksmith, will turn a gun into a garden tool on a forge set up in the parking lot, in a demonstration of the words of the prophet Isaiah: "and they shall beat their swords into plowshares." (*Isaiah 2:4*) The evening will include music and a discussion of the spiritual dynamics of a culture of fear and violence. Attendees will have an opportunity to write the hostilities of their hearts on pieces of paper and then burn them in the forge. Shane will present ideas for ways to address the epidemic of gun violence in America and will eventually be joined by Mike, who will present the tool he has made and give it away. The evening will conclude with a "benediction" in which Shane and Mike will send attendees out to live into the prophet Isaiah's message. Afterward, Shane and Mike will be available to sign copies of their book *Beating Guns: Hope for People Who Are Weary of Violence*.

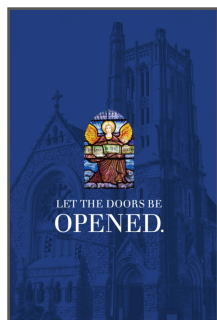

GUILD OF THE CHRIST CHILD

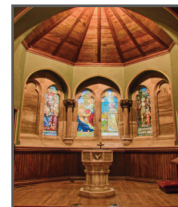
