Is the Education for Ministry Program right for you? It is if you are looking for a small, close-knit community where you are accepted as you are and where you are challenged to develop your personal ministry and theology.



EfM is composed of six to twelve participants who meet weekly during the academic year, along with a trained mentor. These groups read, study, reflect, discuss, and examine their beliefs in order to develop their own understanding of what it means to live into God's kingdom. EfM is a four-year program, but participants only commit to one year at a time. We invite you to join one of the groups beginning this fall. Did you know that the Cathedral has been practicing Creation Care for more than a decade? Here are a few of the sustainable practices that you may not have noticed!



• All Sunday bulletins are printed on

paper and plastics.

recycled paper, and the Cathedral contracts with Earth Savers recycling service to collect and recycle all

• Meals prepared in the Cathedral's kitchen for fewer than 50 persons are served on non-disposable dinnerware.

• HVAC units replaced in the last 10 years have improved energy efficiency and are saving Christ Church Cathedral an estimated \$10,000 a year.

• All light bulbs now replaced with more efficient LED bulbs have reduced energy use by an estimated 25%.
