SUNDAY MORNING CHILDREN'S FORMATION BEGINS SEPTEMBER 8 | 9:45 a.m.

Typical questions about Sunday morning Children's Christian Formation: What do they learn? Who teaches them? Where do I take them? These are just a few of the questions parents and grandparents have as the fall schedule starts up at Christ Church Cathedral.



What do they learn? Children learn how to express their love of Jesus and how to follow Him where he leads through scripture, biblical texts, and the liturgy of the church.

Who teaches? The lessons are presented by an adult, but they learn about Jesus alongside the child, who is listening to God through the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is the program used for children's formation because it is childcentered and faith-based. Where are the classrooms? The classrooms, called atria, are located through-out the Cathedral campus:

- Three-six year olds (through first grade) go to Cheek Hall.
- Seven-ten year olds (second through fifth grade) go to the Annex across the driveway behind the Cathedral.
- Sixth graders go to the Youth rooms in the 810 Building across the street.

In each area, the rooms are clearly marked and there will be volunteers directing children into the appropriate classrooms.
