CREATION CARE NOTES: OCTOBER

Did you know that Nashville residences and businesses produce A MILLION TONS OF WASTE every year?

According to the Metro Department of Public Works, MORE THAN HALF of this waste includes RECYCLABLE material. Another 34.3% COULD BE COMPOSTED, leaving only about 12.3%



to go into the landfill. What a difference it would make if we all recycled properly! The Public Works Department has produced two excellent short videos to explain what does and does not go into the recycling bins and how the recycled material is processed. Both are worth watching to help us all to be better stewards of God's Creation.
