

Did you know that Nashville residences and businesses produce A MILLION TONS OF WASTE every year? According to the Metro Department of Public Works, MORE THAN HALF of this waste includes RECYCLABLE material. Another 34.3% COULD BE COMPOSTED, leaving only about 12.3% to go into the landfill. What a difference
