This year, Advent begins the Sunday after Thanksgiving!

Adults, youth, and children are invited to an Advent Gathering in Cheek Hall on the first Sunday of Advent. This annual parish gathering is a time for fellowship and also offers opportunities to participate in internal and external outreach activities. There will be cookies, coffee, and hot chocolate to enjoy as you join in the fun!



Walking the labyrinth has become a favorite activity, as we follow the ancient prayer rituals in the center of Cheek Hall. You may also make an Advent wreath with your children or for your own use. Having an Advent wreath at home is a lovely and old custom that can help us prepare for the coming of the Christ Child at Christmas. When you light a candle on the wreath each Sunday during Advent, you can say a prayer, sing songs, or keep silent. All of these things help us to watch and wait as we prepare for the coming of our incarnate God. You may bring your own wreath frame or purchase one at the gathering. Fresh greenery, ribbon, and candles will also be available for a small donation.

In addition to Advent wreath-making, all are invited to make packets of chowder mix for St. Luke's Community House to distribute with meals. Children may also make ornaments for the Jesse trees that will be distributed to homebound parishioners before Christmas.

TOILETRIES AND TOYS FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS

The number of asylum seekers passing through the Nashville Greyhound bus station has slowed in recent weeks due to changes in U.S. border policy, but a steady stream of travelers continues to need our support and presence. Asylum seekers who are not turned away on arrival at the southern border are permitted to remain in the U.S. while awaiting a hearing in front of an immigration judge. Many of them pass through Nashville enroute to their temporary housing. It is important to be prepared for the possibility of a new surge in asylum seekers in the coming weeks. We are continuing to collect and package kits of small toiletries for travelers (toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, combs and brushes, deodorant) and soft toys for little ones. As winter weather settles in, lightweight jackets and blankets will help. Other groups are already supplying non-perishable snacks and first aid supplies. Donations of small toiletries and small soft toys can be delivered to Christ Church Cathedral's reception desk, and they will be collected into personal kits for distribution at the bus station.
