Thereafter, the Annual Meeting will be in recess while the Vestry election polls are open.

**AN UPDATE FROM THE DEAN
ON THE 2020 ANNUAL PLEDGE DRIVE AND
ON A FINALIZED 2020 BUDGET**

On Friday, January 17, a balanced program budget for 2020 will be finalized. In 2019, the program budget was predicated on pledges of \$2,045,513. As of this week we have received \$2,026,819 in pledges towards the 2020 program budget, approximately \$19,000 short of the 2019 total. Additionally, the Vestry and I had anticipated the need for an additional \$113,000 dollars in 2020 to provide for:

- Two new program initiatives
 - Open Nave for longer hours with a receptionist
 - additional clergy and musician support for the growing BreakingBread@6 Liturgy;
- increased utility, insurance costs, and increased programming needs for existing programs;
- an additional \$11.3K in support of Christ Church outreach ministries, new and existing; and
- a 2% cost of living increase for members of the staff.

In order to provide for the current level of programming and these additional initiatives, Christ Church Cathedral needs to raise additional pledges/gift intentions of \$132,000 in the next week (the \$19K shortfall in pledges, 2020 over 2019, plus the anticipated \$113K increase for 2020). If we cannot make this number by January 17, your Vestry officers will need to make adjustments in order to provide for a balanced 2020 budget.

Would you make a special one-time gift towards this effort? Perhaps you could increase your pledge for 2020? If it is not your practice to pledge would you consider it this year? If yes, please be in touch with Mark McQueen, Business Administrator, tomorrow at mmcqueen@christcathedral.org

The Vestry and I are keen to move into 2020 from a position of strength. Your prayers and your gifts of time and money will help to make this possible.
