William Driver was born in the seaport town of Salem, Massachusetts, on March 17, 1803. When he turned 13, he went to sea as a cabin boy on a merchant sailing ship. Driver's hard work was rewarded. After his sixth voyage, at age 21, he was promoted to captain. For his new ship, his mother and friends presented him with an American flag (24 feet by 12 feet) that he



proudly named "Old Glory." Jack Benz, his great-great grandson, has just published Old Glory from Salem to Nashville, a beautifully illustrated book about Driver's adventures and world-wide voyages.

TOILETRIES AND TOYS FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS

The number of asylum seekers passing through the Nashville Greyhound bus station has slowed in recent weeks due to changes in U.S. border policy, but a steady stream of travelers continues to need our support and presence. Asylum seekers who are not turned away on arrival at the southern border are permitted to remain in the U.S. while awaiting a hearing in front of an immigration judge. Many of them pass through Nashville enroute to their temporary housing. It is important to be prepared for the possibility of a new surge in asylum seekers in the coming weeks. We are continuing to collect and package kits of small toiletries for travelers (toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, combs and brushes, deodorant) and soft toys for little ones. As winter weather settles in, lightweight jackets and blankets will help. Other groups are already supplying non-perishable snacks and first aid supplies. Donations of small toiletries and small soft toys can be delivered to Christ Church Cathedral's reception desk, and they will be collected into personal kits for distribution at the bus station. Want to help our avian friends during the Winter months? In addition to feeding them....

1. Make windows safer both at night and during the day so that birds don't run into them; up to one billion birds die every year from running into windows in the U.S. and Canada.



- 2. Keep cats indoors; outdoor cats are estimated to kill more than 2.6 billion birds in the U.S. and Canada every year.
- 3. Drink shade-grown coffee; it will help more than 42 migratory species have a place to winter safely.
- 4. Avoid pesticides.
