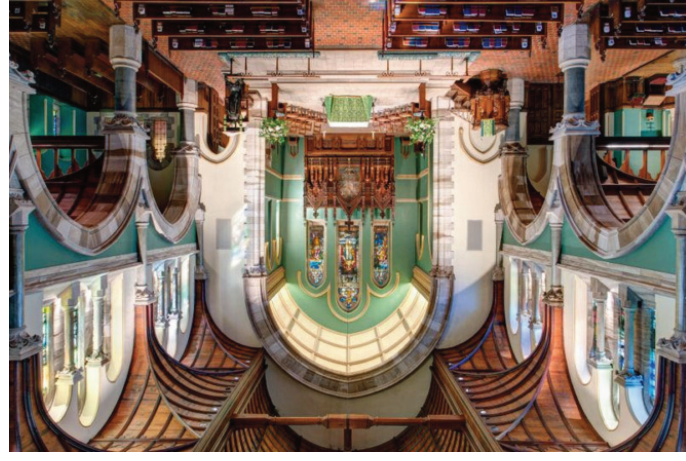

To All Communicants of Christ Church Cathedral:

Later this month, you will have an opportunity to participate in one of the important aspects of parish life at Christ Church Cathedral, the selection of members for the next Vestry class. The 15 elected lay members of the Cathedral Vestry assist the Dean in the management and oversight of the congregation's ministry, proclaiming "the Good News of God in Christ."

At the opening of the 2020 Annual Parish Meeting on January 19 and at the Annual Parish Meeting Business Session on January 26, voting for the Vestry Class of 2023 will take place. This year, the polls will also be open on Wednesday, January 22, from 9 a.m. until noon for those who are unable to be at church on either of the two Sundays. Five of the following 10 parishioners of Christ Church Cathedral will be elected to the Vestry Class of 2023, serving from mid-February 2020 until their three-year terms expire at the Vestry retreat of 2023:

According to Diocesan canons, an eligible voter must be at least 16 years of age, an enrolled, confirmed communicant in good standing of the Cathedral congregation, and present at the polling station at one of the specified dates and times in order to cast a ballot.

The Vestry election results will be communicated electronically to the parish by Monday, January 27, after all nominees have been informed of the results.

Please join me in a careful and prayerful reading of the nominees' profiles before coming to the opening of the Annual Parish Meeting on January 19. Each of these 10 nominees is well-suited to doing the Lord's work, and I know the five who are elected will serve the parish diligently and faithfully.

MEET THE NOMINEES



HOSANNA BANKS

Hosanna has been attending Christ Church Cathedral since moving to Nashville in 1989. She was brought up in the Episcopal church, singing in the choir and serving as a counselor at Camp Galior-Maxon. Her children, Trillium and Gabriel Rice, were baptized at Christ Church and have been Choristers for 11 years. Hosanna worked in the Special Collections and Archives at Vanderbilt University but left to get a master's degree in Information Sciences. She has been a school librarian for 12 years, currently at Murrell Special Education School. At the Cathedral, she is a long-standing member of the Altar Guild, headed up Parish Weekend Away several times, and serves on the Youth Advisory Committee.



DENISE BENTLEY

Denise has been an Episcopalian since 1985. She was introduced to Christ Church Cathedral by Catherine Clark while they were in law school together. After law school, Denise moved to Knoxville to teach at UT. When she returned in 1999, she began attending the Cathedral regularly. Over the past 20 years, she has actively participated in the launch of the Cathedral All City initiative, the Women's Retreat, and the All Women are Daughters Diocesan Initiative. She is a song leader at the Breaking Bread liturgy, a participant in the Parish Choir, and has been a leader in the Sabbatical Priest Program. She also was the first African American Vestry member at Christ Church Cathedral. Denise is executive director of Tennessee Youth Courts, Inc., a nonprofit that works with juvenile courts statewide offering a juvenile delinquency prevention and intervention program. A native of Nashville, she is a graduate of Fisk University and Vanderbilt Law School.



CHRISTINA CALLAWAY

Christina says that during her first few visits to Christ Church Cathedral, she ignored the "silent invitation" to simply connect. However, the sincere love of parishioners foiled her attempt to remain anonymous! In their journey, she and her husband were warmly welcomed into the parish. MEET THE NOMINEES



BRIAN JACKSON

A native of Columbia, Tennessee, Brian has lived in Nashville for 31 years and has been a communicant at Christ Church Cathedral since 2012. He is a graduate of Sewanee and Vanderbilt Law School, and is a partner at the law firm of Butler Snow. He has previously been a member of the board of directors of the Nashville CARES and the Nashville Opera, and is currently a member of the board of directors of the Travelers Rest Historic Site and Museum. At the Cathedral, he serves as a lay reader and a Eucharistic Minister. He is married to Dr. Roger Moore, who teaches at Vanderbilt and is also a Christ Church Cathedral parishioner.



RACHEL MARTIN

Rachel Louise Martin is a writer and historian. Her work revolves around the politics of memory, or how we remember and how we choose to forget the past. Born and raised in Middle Tennessee, she left the area for a decade. When she came back six years ago, she was drawn to Christ Church Cathedral's commitment to sharing the Gospel — a message of repentance, grace, healing and reconciliation — from the corner of 9th and Broad. BROOKS SMITH

Brooks has been a member of Christ Church Cathedral since 1999, when he moved back to Nashville, but really beginning in 1986 when he moved to Nashville for the first time. Since 1999, Brooks has maintained involvement at the Cathedral in many ways, including ongoing work negotiating the ground lease for parking lot C as a member of the Third Party Partnership Working Group. He is one of three 7 a.m. Sacristians and continues to assist the Altar Guild each Friday at the 12:15 Liturgy. He also serves on the board of the Episcopal School of Nashville. Brooks is a transactional commercial real estate attorney at Bradley Arant Boult Cummings, an adjunct professor of law at Belmont University School of Law, and the municipal judge for the City of Forest Hills. He and his wife Janna have a 17 year-old daughter and 15 year-old son. He also attends to two dogs, two cats, six chickens, and approximately 60,000 bees, give or take a few.



ANDREA TUCKER

Andrea grew up at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Antioch and transferred to Christ Church Cathedral in the summer of 2014. She helped facilitate the relaunch of the Greater Ministry in the fall of 2018, is a contributor on the Cathedral Facebook page, and is the current chair of the Commission for Evangelism. Under her leadership, the Evangelism Commission partnered with the Nashville Humane Association to raise needed supplies for the shelter during the annual Blessing of the Animals liturgy this past year.
