## **ABOUT THE ARTIST**



Dr. Bálint Karosi is Cantor at Saint Peter's Church in New York City. There he directs the classical music program with frequent performances of cantatas and new commissions. He established the Saint Peter's Bach Collegium with an annual performance of one of J. S. Bach's passions on period instruments. Previously, Dr. Karosi served as Minister of Music at the First Lutheran Church of Boston, where he established a Bach Cantata Vespers series, recorded three CDs, raised funds for the completion of the Richards and Fowkes Op. 10 organ, and founded the annual Boston Bach Birthday.

Dr. Karosi has had an active career as a solo recitalist, including performances at the Thomaskirche and Gewandhaus in Leipzig, Saint Sulpice in Paris, the St. Petri Dom in Bremen, at Izumi Hall in Osaka and Minato Mirai Hall in Yokohama, the National Concert Hall, the Liszt Academy and the Matthias Church in Budapest, the historic organs in St Jakobi and Marienkirche in Lübeck, the Schnittger

Organ in Norden and Leer, Victoria Hall and Cathédrale St Pierre de Genève, among others. He has published five CDs, including his one of his original compositions, *The Art of Fugue, Clavier-Übung III* and *The Leipzig Chorales* by Bach released by the Hungaroton, Dulzian and Dorian labels.

An active composer, Dr. Karosi received commissions and performances by the Budapest Philharmonic Orchestra, the Boston Modern Orchestra Project, Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, Spectrum Symphony of New York, the New Hungarian Music Society (UMZE), Musiciens Libres, the Miskolc Symphony Orchestra, Anima Musica Chamber Orchestra, Antico Moderno, the Norfolk Festival Chorus, the Yale Philharmonia Orchestra, Canto Armonico and the Boston Choral Ensemble. His first opera "Lonely Hearts" is based on an American Story of a fraudulent dating service that was commissioned by the Hungarian National Opera House. His works include three cantatas, three concertos for organ, concertos for harpsichord, clarinet, baroque violins, a triple concerto for harp, cimbalom and guitar, works for solo organ, choir, and works ranging from full symphony orchestra to solo and chamber music. He has six volumes of organ music published by Wayne Leupold Editions. His composition "Toccata in memory of Béla Bartók" (2007) has been selected for the finals of the 2020 American Guild of Organists National Young Artist Competition, where all the finalists have to perform this composition. He conducted the US premier of his "Erkel Overture," a 2016 commission by the Hungarian National Opera House as part of the High Note Hungary Festival at Koch Theatre at Lincoln Center in 2018.

Dr. Karosi the recipient of the Charles Ives Scholarship for composition by the American Academy of Arts and Letters and the first prizes at the 16<sup>th</sup> International Bach Competition in Leipzig, the 2002 Dublin Intl. Organ Competition, the 2005 Syracuse Organ Competition, the 2002 St Maurice Organ Competition, the 2005 Miami Organ Competition. He also earned second place as a clarinetist at the 2001 Prague Spring International Clarinet Competition. He holds degrees (including two on the clarinet) from the Liszt Academy in Budapest, the Conservatoire de Genève, the Oberlin Conservatory, and earned his Doctor of Musical Arts in Composition at Yale University.
