CAPTAIN WILLIAM DRIVER: PART THREE OF SIX "OLD GLORY" DURING THE CIVIL WAR

On February 27, 1862, after the fall of Nashville to the Federal Army, William Driver, a Union man, asked the commanding general if "Old Glory" could be raised over the Tennessee State Capitol. Permission was granted. Two weeks later, *Harper's Weekly* magazine published a sketch of "Old Glory" flying over the State Capitol. Captain Driver and "Old Glory" became famous throughout the country.

RITE OF RECONCILIATION

The third graders in our parish who come to Catechesis of the Good Shepherd on Sunday mornings have a special opportunity to grow in grace. They will come together over five Sundays to read and meditate on particular scriptures and to pray for themselves and others. They will read and then discuss Jesus's parables of love, forgiveness, and joy. During a day-long retreat at the end of the five weeks, they will each talk with a priest about where in



their lives they haven't used the gifts that have been given them and what gifts they have used well. They will have the opportunity to say "I'm sorry" and to be changed by Jesus's love. This love shown to us by Jesus is expressed through the priest as an absolution. This is formally called "The Reconciliation of a Penitent" in the Book of Common Prayer. At the Eucharist on that day, they will celebrate with Jesus and with each other the forgiveness of those sins.

There are two gifts that we look at during these weeks together: confession and communion. God created an amazing world and then when we fell short, He sent Jesus to redeem us, to make it right again. Anyone can tell you where they have fallen short, not made the right choices, allowed evil and sin to grow. Our world and each of us individually have been given numerous gifts. We often do not use these gifts as we should; sometimes we do not use them at all. Being able to say "I'm sorry" is a great relief. Saying this in the context of Jesus's abiding love and care is truly wonderful. It is a form of saying "thank you" for the gifts we have been given. Coming together to share the Eucharist, to be in communion with Jesus and each other, is a joyous occasion.

Starting today, please pray for this year's class of third graders, their families, our priests, and the catechists joining with them in this process.
