RITE OF RECONCILIATION

The third graders in our parish who come to Catechesis of the Good Shepherd on Sunday mornings have a special opportunity to grow in grace. They will come together over five Sundays to read and meditate on particular scriptures and to pray for themselves and others. They will read and then discuss Jesus's parables of love, forgiveness, and joy. During a day-long retreat at the end of the five weeks, they will each talk with a priest about where in



their lives they haven't used the gifts that have been given them and what gifts they have used well. They will have the opportunity to say "I'm sorry" and to be changed by Jesus's love. This love shown to us by Jesus is expressed through the priest as an absolution. This is formally called "The Reconciliation of a Penitent" in the Book of Common Prayer. At the Eucharist on that day, they will celebrate with Jesus and with each other the forgiveness of those sins.

There are two gifts that we look at during these weeks together: confession and communion. God created an amazing world and then when we fell short, He sent Jesus to redeem us, to make it right again. Anyone can tell you where they have fallen short, not made the right choices, allowed evil and sin to grow. Our world and each of us individually have been given numerous gifts. We often do not use these gifts as we should; sometimes we do not use them at all. Being able to say "I'm sorry" is a great relief. Saying this in the context of Jesus's abiding love and care is truly wonderful. It is a form of saying "thank you" for the gifts we have been given. Coming together to share the Eucharist, to be in communion with Jesus and each other, is a joyous occasion.

Please pray for this year's class of third graders, their families, our priests, and the catechists joining with them in this process.



CAPTAIN WILLIAM DRIVER: PART FOUR OF SIX CHRIST CHURCH DURING THE CIVIL WAR

Christ Church was divided during the war. William Driver and Francis B. Fogg, both Vestrymen, were loyal to the Union. After the Federal Occupation of Nashville in 1862, churches were commandeered for use as hospitals and other military purposes. Christ Church remained open for services. Perhaps these two Vestrymen had influence with the Federal authorities. Local families



were also divided. Sons of Driver and Fogg, serving in the Confederate Army, were killed in battle.
