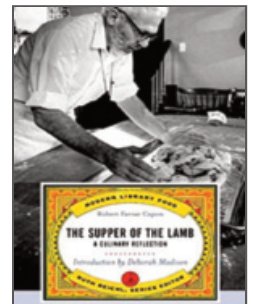

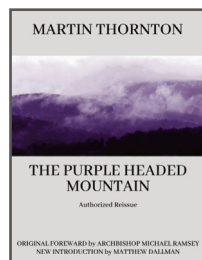

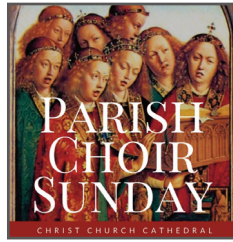

## CAPTAIN WILLIAM DRIVER: PART FIVE OF SIX FAMILY LEAVES CHRIST CHURCH

William Driver served on the Christ Church Vestry from 1858 to 1871. In 1866, W.J. Ellis was called to be the rector. In 1871, the Reverend Ellis recommended that the system of rented pews end and all pews be "free." Pew rentals provided funds for the rector's salary and upkeep of the church building. The Vestry rejected this proposal. The Reverend Ellis resigned. The Parish Registers recorded William Driver and family "gone to Ellis." Christ Church pew rentals were not discontinued until 1918.
