8th Resolved That the City of Valley write to
the Com^{tee} Committee of the Poor & Foreign
Missionary Socy of the Pres of the U.S. for
the purpose of procuring a salary for the
Rector

The following letter was written in obedience
to the eighth resolution of the Vestry

Bethel February 10th 1831.

To the Executive Committee of the Newbern &
Foothills Missionary Society of the Protestant
Episcopal Church — The Vestry of "Three
Union Churches" respectfully represent

That the Church in this place is yet
in its infancy consisting of only three
organized congregations neither of which
have yet exceed a house of rental

That this Vestry has made some
preparatory arrangements and intend
commencing the building of a Church
object early in the ensuing month

That they have elected the Revd Geo
Weller to be their Rector and that he
is now settled among them

That they wish to receive his entire
services which they believe will be
useful to them — That the congregation
being yet small the expense of
securing a church will fall heavily
upon them and will require the im-
mense sum of one or nearly one thousand
dollars for ecclesiastical purposes
during the present year and that with the
usual subscriptions of a few individuals they
are not able to raise a salary sufficient
for their Rector's support until the
completion of this Church when they
trust and believe all difficulties on this
point will disappear — That having
considerable sums have been raised by
Rev'd Dr. Hopkins during his late tour
especially for aiding the growth of the

Church in the West and understand
the object of this application meets the
application as they doubt not it will
be of service hereafter they argue
a salary as missionary may be allowed to
the Revd Mr. Weller for the current
year as the income of the Revd Geo
Weller who has removed from this
place The Vestry would also
express their gratitude to the Society
for the salary allowed ^{to the Revd Mr. Weller} by whom ever
the congregation have been best
legitimated and more advanced they trust
in the knowledge of religion and the
principles of the Church

Stewart junior Warden. L. M. Fogg

Treasurer. It was then Resolved
Resolved, That the junior Warden or the Senior

to Mr. Stevens to endeavor to prevail upon
him to remove the partition in the Masonic
Hall; and that they be also a committee to
procure subscriptions to obtain additional seats.

Resolved, That until further order, Divine Service commence on every Sunday at 10. o'clock A.M. and at 5. o'clock P.M.

Resolved, That the building committee be authorized to make such arrangements to break off the contract heretofore made with Mr. Mathews, & to enter into one with Mr. Hugh Roland as it may seem expedient.

At a meeting of the vestry of Christ's Church held at the office of G. M. Fogg, Present Rev. Dr. Miller, Mr. Shelly, Mr. Clairborne, James Stewart, G. B. Fogg, Matthew Watson & G. W. Fogg.

The Secy. presented the resignation of Henry Baldwin Jr. as a vestry man which was accepted.

The following resolutions were then adopted unanimous^d

Resolved, That the thanks of the vestry of Christ's Church, Nashville be presented to Mr. Diggins for his zealous services as leader of the choir in the congregation for some time past, and that he be respectfully requested to continue his useful services in the same capacity.

Resolved, That the vestry approve of a weekly meeting for practicing vocal Music for the improvement and advancement of the choir to be held at some suitable room to be obtained by a committee of the vestry, and Friday evening as the most suitable time. And that Mr. Diggins be respectfully requested to attend as leader or chorister. Also that notice be given from the desk by the Rector, and such of the congregation ~~as~~ may be desirous to attend said meeting for musical improvement be invited to do so.

Resolved, That Dr. Shelly & Mr. G. M. Fogg be appointed a committee to procure a suitable room for the above purpose, and to endeavor to obviate any difficulty which may interfere with the object in view.

At a meeting of the vestry of Christ's Church held at the office of G. M. Fogg present Rev. Dr. Miller, Mr. Shelly, Mr. Clairborne, James Stewart, M. Watson & G. M. Fogg.

Resolved, That the Rev. Mr. Miller be called to the communion appointed on the 19th March for the purpose of reclaiming the property left the Episcopal Church, in the place of H. Baldwin, resigned.

Resolved That Dr. Shultz, Col. G. Wilson
& G.M. Fogg be appointed delegates to attend
the meeting of the convention of the clerical
clay delegates of the Protestant Episcopal
Church of this state to be held at Franklin
on the 1st July next.

At a meeting of the members of the
congregation of Daniel's Chapel held at
the Masonic Hall in Nashville on
Monday evening the 13th Sept. 1830
for the purpose of electing two vestry men
to supply the place of Henry Baldwin
and James Stewart, ~~and Wm. Talbot~~
then the chair. Upon counting the ballots
it appeared that Eli Talbot & James
Digges were duly elected.

On motion Resolved. That the articles of
association recommended by the last diocesan
convention of this state to the several con-
gregations composing this diocese be adopted
and that the Secretary of the vestry be directed
to prepare a copy of the same, and receive the
signatures of all those disposed to sign the
same. Adjourned

At a meeting of the vestry of Church Church
Nashville, held at the office of G.M. Fogg
on Wednesday evening 15th Sept. 1830 present
Rev. George Miller in the Chair, Thomas
Clarkson, John Shultz, G.B. Fogg, Eli Talbot,
& G.M. Fogg.

Ordered That the vestry do now proceed to the
election of a junior Warden to supply the
vacancy occasioned by the resignation of James
Stewart, and that they proceed by ballot
upon counting the ballots after various ineffec-
tual trials it appeared that G.M. Fogg
was duly elected.

On motion Ordered, That the junior Warden
be directed to employ a person to prepare the hall
for public worship on Sunday's afternoons

Ordered That the vestry do now proceed to the
election of a member of the building committee
to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation
of James Stewart. W. Talbot was then nomi-
nated and elected by unanimous consent.

Ordered. That the Rector be empowered to
direct the architect of the church in the
arrangement of the chancel and the pulpit.

Ordered. That Mipes H.B. Fogg, Talbot &
the Treasurer be appointed a committee to
obtain additional subscriptions for building
the church,

be given W. Shields in Bank for \$5.00. in part
payment for the stone work at the Chapel. Which
note was accordingly executed to the said Shields
by all the members present.

The Rector having retired it was
Resolved, That the members of the vestry each of
them take a subscription paper and ascertain
what amount can be obtained for the support
of the Rector for the year 1831. and report to the next
meeting of the vestry.

Resolved, That application be made by the
Secretary of the vestry to the Protestant Epis-
opal Missionary Society for their assistance in
the support of Mr. Weller the ensuing year.

Adjourned.

At a meeting of the vestry held at the office of
G. M. Fogg on the 29th November 1830 present
Rev'd G. Weller, Thomas Clairborne, Watson, T. B. Fogg,
Dugouge, Talbot & G. M. Fogg.

Resolved, That the journeymen at present employed
on the church, so soon as their present contract is
completed with, be discharged, and that the
carpenter work and the plastering the interior
of the church, be let out by the job, and that
money be borrowed upon the credit of the
vestry, if practicable, from time to time to complete
the same and that the money of the sale of the
pews or the pre-emption right thereof, be pledged
for refunding such sum as cannot be raised by
subscription.

The Rector having retired

Resolved, That Miss Watson & G. M. Fogg
be appointed a committee to confer with
the Rev'd G. Weller and to offer him the sum
of one thousand dollars for his services for the
ensuing year.
