There being no other business the
meeting adjourned sine die.

At a meeting of the Vestry of Epiphany Church
on Monday night April 29th 1861 Present
the Rev. L. S. Smith, F. B. Fogg, G. M. Fogg, J. A.

tion to be held at Somerville on Wednesday

adjourned.

At a meeting of the Vestry held on Mon-
day the 4th November 1861 Present
Messrs F. B. Fogg in the chair, J. Kirk-
man, Bankhead, Concord, Gar-
rett, Wm. L. Fogg,

Mr. F. B. Fogg presented to
the vestry the letter from the Rev.
L. S. Smith resigning the pastorate
of Epiphany Church from and after
the first of January, 1862, with the
condition that he be permitted to sup-
ply the pulpit at his own expense
until that time & shall be permitted
to go to Norfolk Va., with his
family immediately.

The following resolutions were then
unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the resignation of the Rev.
L. S. Smith as pastor of the congregation
of Epiphany Church, be and the same
is hereby accepted, and that on behalf
and congregation extend him our
sincere thanks for the constant and faithful
performance of the arduous and munici-
pial duties of his Pastoral charge.

Resolved, That it is with deep regret we
apart to his acquirement and a part to the
dissolution of the connection which has so
long and happily existed between himself
the vestry and congregation of Epiphany
for over four years and a half, but we have
enjoyed the services of our Pastor there
has been the utmost harmony and

confidence between him and the Vestry and congregation and our intercourse has been most agreeable and kind. His great moral and religious excellence have been very eminently displayed and his learning and eminent abilities, his high literary standing as a Preacher of the Gospel have elicited our warmest approbation. Under his care we have been enlightened and instructed in the great principles of Christianity and in the interpretation of the Sacred Scriptures, he has shown uncommon research and acute investigation.

The Vestry on behalf of themselves & the congregation, tender to our Rector and his family, the warmest wishes for their happiness and prosperity and earnestly hope that their removal to their native home may be attended with every temporal & spiritual blessing.

At a meeting of the vestry of Buxton Church held on Monday the 30th December
Present Dr B. Poggs Senior Warden in the chair. Mr John Kirkman, Mr Willm. Watson, Bankhead, Crawford & G M Poggs.

The Secretary presented a statement of the amounts of the money received with him which were ordered to be paid, and it was thereupon ordered that the Sec'y be requested to notify all delinquent pew holders that unless they pay up their

dues promptly their pews will be rented to some one else.

On Motion Dr B. Poggs & G. Carroll were appointed to wait on the Rev. Smith, of the ^{Adventist} who has officiated in the church for the past six weeks, and to tender him the thanks for the valuable services he has rendered and also to represent to him that on the present disturbed condition of our national affairs and the peculiar condition of the congregation, the vestry were not disposed to employ any persons officiate permanently as a Pastor, but that if satisfied his convenience the vestry would be glad to have him remain with us until he could obtain a permanent location or also if he should decline to remain upon those terms, that they be directed to apply to some other clergyman to officiate in the church for a limited time, and to report what they had done to a subsequent meeting of the vestry.

G W Poggs the Secretary & Treasurer of the vestry tendered his resignation of both those offices in consequence of having other engagements that would occupy so much of his time that he could not perform the duties properly. This was accepted. Whereupon Mr Bankhead was invited. Mr A. Crawford to fill the vacant place who was unanimously elected to take effect on & after the 1st January 1843.

It having been announced that James
Whitcombe had depcited his life,
On motion Russell Weston was then
unanimously elected vestry man to
fill his place, ^{as} adjourned,
