ask your body, should the proposition  
meet with your favor to appoint a  
committee of its members to meet

the Vestry of our Church on Monday evening met at 7 o'clock at the Vestry room of the Church of the Advent to concur together upon the subject.

If deemed more advisable by your body in order to a more free and full interchange of views upon the matter your entire vestry is cordial by invited to meet with us as above.

It was agreed to admit as individual members of the congregation, as we had no power as a vestry,

Mrs. Buckingham and Clark and appointed a committee to confer with the above as to salaries, being authorized to offer the Organist Five Hundred and the Tenor One Hundred and Fifty Dollars a year.

Wish to know if the Vestry has called any other minister or if the door be still open for me. signed Wm. Graham  
Letters were read which had been received from parishes recommending pastries to our parishes.

A letter from Rev Mr. Everett of Carlisle Penn was read in which he stated he was so much attached to his own parish he could not entertain a call from any source.

The Secy was instructed to reply to Mr. Graham. Adjourned to meet next Sunday.

Your communication  
of the 24<sup>th</sup> Jan'y reached us this morn'g

renewing the call to the Reckonings of  
Christ's Church at a salary of Twenty Five  
Hundred Dollars.

When I wrote a private letter to  
Col Reed indicating that were the call  
renewed I would unhesitatingly accept,  
it was under the conviction that in such  
an event, the call would be in all as-  
pects, similar to the one contained in  
your communication of the 20<sup>th</sup> last.  
Such, however, is not the case. I am  
sorry, Gentlemen, that I can not, under  
any circumstances, even entertain any  
proposal from any quarter on the terms  
proposed in your official communica-  
tion of the 24<sup>th</sup> Jan'y. My second hand  
is certain and sure, and instead of a pro-  
spect of any diminution, there is every  
probability of its being increased to  
\$3000 ere long.

In consideration, however, of what  
I stated in a private note to one of the  
Vestry, I am still willing to accept  
and do accept your call provided  
the Vestry bind themselves to give a  
permanent salary of Three Thousand  
Dollars per annum.

Allow me to suggest, with a  
view of expediting matters, that if the  
Vestry agree to receive my accept  
and on the terms above stated, they  
will kindly send me a telegram  
to that effect, as I can not take any  
action with my Vestry until I  
hear from them.

It was moved that we call Revd Mrd Graham of Baltimore Md at a salary of Three Thousand Dollars per annum. It was put to vote and carried only Mr Cooley voting in the negative who wished it understood he voted this for this reason. Our church was in debt had been so for years, even when our expense were less than we now proposed to make them, and he desired either to curtail our expenses or by some means pay off our present indebtedness and we called a rector at \$3,000 - that he would contribute to such an object.

The Secy was instructed to telegraph Rev Mrd Graham that we would pay a salary of Three Thousand Dollars. on Sabbath we adjourned -

At a meeting of the Vestry called this day Messrs Fogg, Mitchell, Reed, Alcott, Simmons, Cushingham, Cooley and Clark were present.

The following letters read by the Secy were read.

Gentlemen.

Your telegram reached me on Thursday last, to the effect that you had agreed to give the Rector of Christ Church a permanent

salary of Three Thousand Dollars per annum, and on that distinct understanding I accept your call as stated in my communication of the 20<sup>th</sup> inst.

That being definitely and finally settled, I accept the rectorship of your parish with pleasure, and you may rest assured that it will be my constant endeavor to do all I can to promote the efficiency and prosperity of your parish.

I should have liked very much if I could have commenced my duties of the Rectoryship by the beginning of Lent, but I fear that that is now impracticable. I have consulted with one or two of my vestry here and I find I can not get off before the end of the present month. But you may rely on my being with you, without fail, by the first Sunday in March.

At 5 o'clock P.M April 10<sup>th</sup> 1871  
The congregation met to elect a Vestry  
for the ensuing year.

The Dr made a verbal statement of  
the finances of the church saying  
we were out of debt. He begged that he  
be allowed to make his financial state-  
ment at the first meeting of the new Vestry.  
Sicknes and pressure of other work having  
made it impossible for him to get up a  
statement. It was granted.

The old Vestry was then reelected &  
W. A. Hale added to the number for the  
ensuing year.

The Vestry then organized, and S. M. S.  
Clark was elected Secy & Dr. - J. B. Fogg  
& Chas Mitchell Jr. & Junia Hartman.

The Lyr & Pews reported they had  
succeeded in ~~saving~~ <sup>paying</sup> most of the pews  
and several <sup>had</sup> promised to increase  
the amount paid for their pews.

Saturday at 5 o'clock was appointed  
as the time of our next meeting.  
On motion the Vestry adjourned.

\$19.97 and our resources from all  
sources to be \$9.50 so, and possibly  
some of the amounts due for pews which  
may not be collected for some time,  
and it may be one of them not at all.  
The estimate for the coming year  
was Probable expenses \$4.780. - and  
our income as the pews are now  
rented \$3640. - Showing we would  
fall short \$1220. -

It was proposed that four of the  
members assist the Dr to collect  
and that an equal offering be appro-  
priated to the Sunday School in lieu  
thereof. Thus saving \$160.

Mrs Reed & Johnson were appointed  
a Committee on Pews and instructed  
to rent as many as possible and also  
to apply to as many of the pews holders  
as they could meet asking them to  
increase their pew rent.

Some favored the plan of raising the pew  
rents throughout the church, but others  
thought it best to try the other plan.

The Treasurer reported he had been paying all expenses monthly. That he had collected \$424 <sup>34</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars & paid out \$423 <sup>96</sup>/<sub>100</sub> leaving a balance on hand of Forty Eight Cents.

The Rector read a communication from J. M. Schwansey relative to the Contingent Fund Assessment amounting to Fifty six <sup>25</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars. The Es were instructed to pay a part

of it at least as soon as possible.

The quarterly statement shows that we were all the year rents collected we would still owe thirty one thousand dollars. - But as quite an amount was collected of the second quarter to close up old accounts the prospect for paying our way hence forth is quite encouraging.

On motion the above report was accepted. A letter relative to the division of the diocese was read by the Deacon. After some discussion the question was put to vote and unanimously decided in favor of the division and the parish through the vestry pledged to pay for the support of the new Bishop Four hundred and fifty dollars.
