At the regular meeting of the Vestry held in the Vestry room at 4.30 P.M. there were present the Rector, and Messrs Robinson, Gale Clark, Drummond & Mitchell Johnson and Payne.

Considerable discussion ^{was had} followed in reference to the rentals, and the more prompt collection of the same, which was followed by the adoption of the following resolutions; "Resolved, that all pews be declared vacant at the end of each financial year of the Church, and be re-let for the ensuing year, occupants for the past year, not in arrears for paid rents, to have priority right to same." It was also resolved, that a communication be prepared, to be read by the Rector to the Congregation, Sunday Dec 24th, in the name of the Vestry, setting forth the great and increasing deficiencies ^{between} the receipts and the necessary expenses of the Church, and urging the Congregation to greater efforts to bring up arrears of paid rents, &c." Messrs Clark, Robinson,

and Drummond were appointed a committee to prepare this communication, and directed also to Enlarge ^{in the evening} the foregoing resolution, in reference to the annual letting of pews. It was also resolved that the usual annual report be published, details to be decided upon at a special meeting to be held after 8. at 4.30 P.M. Communication from the City Marshal received, directing repairs to be made to High St pavement. Refers to Mr Mitchell for attention. Mr ^{Johnson} was appointed a committee to see Prof Hemmberg, and state that if he would be the highest salary the Vestry could pay him for his services as organist the coming year. Adjourned to next after 9.15.

Church Church, April 5th 1878.

At an adjourned meeting of the Vestry, held as above there were present, the Rector, President and Messrs Smith Robinson, Gale, Johnson, Mitchell Clark and Payne. After prayer by the Rector, the minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved. Regarding the clause "appointing a committee to see Prof Hemmberg, and offer him \$ Jan for his services as organist for the ensuing year" The publication of the Annual Report was discussed in detail and it was resolved that it be printed, as last year, with comparative statement of the receipts and expenditures for the two preceding years, also that it contain an explanatory clause, showing what amounts had been collected in arrears

if Paid rents past due and unpaid for previous years - Mr. Mitchell reported having had a conversation with Miss Bradley, in reference to engaging her services as Organist for ensuing year, and that she declined making any offer, until Prof. Hainbury had declined remaining. After some discussion upon the subject, it was resolved to offer Prof. Hainbury \$300 for his services for ensuing year, and the Secretary directed to so inform him.
