Special meeting of the Vestry, held in  
the basement of the church immediately  
after meeting Service - Present the Rector  
Messrs. Wells, Wardlaw, Clark, Blane,  
Adams, Robinson and Payne. The Rector  
read a communication from the Rector  
of Christ Church, Clarksville referring  
to the proposed division of the diocese  
at the approaching General Convention  
at Philadelphia, and setting the "disposition"

of the Vestry of <sup>Christ</sup> Church in the effort to defeat  
the Slave. At the request of the Rector, the  
Vestry read the Resolution adopted at the  
regular meeting of the Vestry June 18<sup>th</sup>  
in which the proposed division was  
declared inexpedient. The following reso-  
lution and Resolution were introduced  
and seconded.

To the General Convention of the Protestant  
Episcopal Church, U.S. 1883

Whereas there is reason to believe that  
the General Convention will be called, at its  
approaching Session, to act upon West  
Tennessee as a separate jurisdiction, and

Whereas, a decree, consisting of but  
thirty (30) parishes, less than half of which  
are well sustained, does not warrant, in  
the opinion of this Vestry, a division of  
the diocese.

Whereas the individual pledges of the  
remaining part of the diocese (middle and  
East Tennessee) being limited to 5 years, have  
in the opinion of this Vestry, no paramount  
value.

Whereas such action as is contemplated  
would be unfair to the remaining portion of  
the diocese as to render the paramount, with-  
out support of the Episcopate thereof, in  
the opinion of this Vestry, impossible, therefore  
Resolved, that the Rector, Wardlaw,  
and Vestry of Christ Church Parish, Clarksville,  
do hereby respectfully but most firmly  
protest against the division of the diocese  
of Tennessee at this time.

Resolved that the Rector, and the  
Deby, of the Vestry be authorized to sign  
the above Report in the name of the  
Vestry of Church Church Parish, and to  
transmit the same to the General Convention  
through one of the delegates.

Pending the motion to adopt the  
foregoing, it was moved and seconded  
that they be laid upon the table. A  
rising vote, being called for, it was  
found that the latter motion had been  
lost. Motion being now taken upon the  
original motion, it was carried by a  
majority of one.

Mr. Gardner then read the Report of the Committee appointed and authorized to purchase a Church Lot which was in substance, that they had bought the lot on corner of Second and Mr. Leaven Sts. containing 89 feet on Second and 160 feet on Mr. Leaven St. for \$10,000, agreeing to pay Cash \$12,000 and give the Master of the Vestry of Christ Church for 4 years in equal payments of \$1000 each, at 1. 2. and 3 years, with interest from date; that they had received a deed from the property, which had been duly registered, and was now in the hands of the proper officers of the Vestry; that the Master of the Vestry, Mr. Dr. Gardner, had turned over to him \$11,800 of City & Towns which had been deposited by, meeting the Govt. To make the cash payment, and return to the Society a Surplus balance; and that they had effected the transfer of the "Wardens and Vestrymen of Christ Church", signed by Mr. C. Gardner, Master Warden, and Charles Mitchell Jr. Master Warden for

the deferred payments. The Vestry satisfied  
the Report, adopted the same, and dis-  
charged the Committee.

Discussion then ensued, as to the  
management of the property, and it was  
decided that the Treasurer take charge of  
it, and the necessary expenses, pay from  
the last day all charges occurring, and keep  
the balance in Bank to credit of the  
Wardens and Vestry, in separate and  
distinct account.

Carry on Peas Department some ad-

some vacated, with several desirable
