May 15 1911

The Vestry held the regular monthly meeting. The following members were present: Messrs Martin, Brandon, Davison, Lyall, Gray, Mitchell, Bransford, Clark. - The Rector was unavoidably detained for a short time.

Sen. Warden Martin opened the meeting - The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

Mr Brandon. Chr. Music Com. reported that Mr Briggs had closed an engagement to sing elsewhere. That Mr Briggs, the tenor, had been offered an advance of ten dollars per mo. elsewhere, but would remain with us for an advance of five per mo.

Miss Woodall had also asked for an increase.

Pew Com. made no report.

On motion the Rector's salary was raised to \$4,000.<sup>00</sup> per annum, to begin Apr. 15, 1911.

Com. Systematic <sup>Collection</sup> - Chas. M. an report ed he had used all the envelopes printed.

A letter from Miss M. L. Spow relative to the height & position of the pulpit was read. The Secy was requested to acknowledge it, & put the letter on file.

The Treas. did not make a written report. He stated he had paid (\$300.<sup>00</sup>) three hundred dollars on the note of \$800.<sup>00</sup> (eight hundred) due the bank leaving five hundred still unpaid.

The old Vestry then adjourned. The roll of new vestry was then called.

Mr. Brandau suggested that Mr. Hart, a local architect, who is highly recommended by the <sup>Mr. Kimball</sup> ~~New York~~ architect be employed.

It was moved by Mr. Robinson that the committee confer with Mr. Hart. Motion carried.

Special Committee on Parish House, Mr. Brandau reported that Mr. Hart, a resident architect, highly recommended by the New York architects whom he had consulted, had been furnished with the original plans of the church and was at work. Mr. Hart has been instructed to report and submit drawings.

Mr. Martin moved that the committee be continued, subject to the call of the vestry when Mr. Hart is ready to report.

Mr. Gale, Treasurer, submitted <sup>second</sup> ~~his~~ <sup>and carried</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>following</sup> report. The treasurer requested that an auditor be engaged to audit the books. Mr. Martin moved that the finance committee be authorized to have this done and if necessary an accountant be employed to do the book. Motion carried.
