

Nashville, Tenn. Jan. 7th, 1924.

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council was held in the Parish House. The following being present:- The Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Martin, Lambeth, Brandau, Gray, Gale, Rogers, Wheeler, Wright, Tupper, Mc. Clelland, Crandall, Mitchell and Dr. Wilson of the vestry and Messrs. Lander, Linton, Castner, Wharton and Hillman of the Council.

The Meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector read a telegram from Mrs. Ada Loaring Clark to the effect that \$500.00 was needed to complete the Bishop Beatty Memorial Fund and asking that Christ Church Parish assume \$100.00 of this amount. Mr. Martin moved that a committee be appointed to make an effort to raise the amount requested. Seconded by Mr. Tupper and carried. The Rector appointed Messrs. Martin, Nelson and Tupper.

A communication was read from the Revd. Frank Juhan asking information regarding Christ Church Parish's Nation Wide subscription. The Rector was authorized to furnish the information.

A card of appreciation from Mrs. H. C. Tolman and Family was read.

The Senior Warden read a letter from Mr. R. Bland Mitchell, Auxilliary Secretary of the National Council requesting Dr. Dandridge to accept a position as Auxilliary Secretary to the Field Department of the Council. The Senior Warden thought that for Dr. Dandridge to accept would involve considerable sacrifice both on his part and on the parish. Dr. Dandridge stated that he felt that for him to accept would be unwise at this time and that he had so advised Mr. Mitchell. Mr. Martin moved that it was the sense of the Vestry after consultation with the Rector that it would be unwise for him to accept outside work at this time. Seconded and carried.

The Rector read his monthly communication.

Mr. Wright moved that the action of the Rector in having the treasurer advance a check for \$25.00 to defray the expense of sending a representative to the Student's Volunteer Convention be approved. Seconded by Mr. Martin and carried.

The Senior Warden reported that the Diocesan Convention would be held in Clarksville, Jan. 14th, 15th and 16th. and that delegates should be elected. The election resulted as follows; Messrs. Martin, Wright and Castner, alternates Messrs. Mc Clelland, Wheeler and Lambeth.

Treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright.

Minutes of Jan. 7th continued.

Reports of Committees were called for.

Special Committee on Canvass. Mr. Tupper reported that \$33678.50 had been subscribed.

Dr. Wilson moved that the treasurer be directed to pay to St Luke's Communiy House the sum of \$175.00 per month until the sum of \$1800.00 shall have been paid and that the board of St. Luke's be apprised of this action. Seconded by Mr. Tupper and carried.

Committee on the purchase of a Multigraph and Addressograph. Mr. Rogers reported naming the amounts required for the purchase of these machines. It was the sense of the meeting that the expenditure of the amounts involved was not justified at this time. Several members offered the use of their machines for any special work that might be required. Mr. Wright moved that these offers be gratefully and thankfully accepted. Seconded and carried.

New Business.

The matter of stimulating attendance at the coming Parish Meeting on Jan. 14th was discussed. Mr. Crandall moved that a committee be appointed to get out a strong letter asking the congregation to attend. Mr. Martin offered a substitute motion, which was accepted that the Rector and chairman of the Zone System take the matter in hand and endeavor to get out as many as possible. Seconded and carried.

Mr. Wright brought up the matter of a rotating vestry. No action was taken.

There being no further business, upon motion duly seconded, the meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the newly elected Vestry of Christ Church was held in the Parish House this Monday, Jan'y 28th, 1924 at 7.30 P.M., the following being present:  
The Rector, Messrs W. H. Lambeth, W. R. Cole, Jno. H. Wheeler, Vernon Tupper, A. G. Brandau, Chas. Hunt, Dr. O. H. Wilson and Joseph A. Gray.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

Upon motion, duly seconded and adopted Joseph A. Gray was requested to act as Secretary.

The Rector stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of organizing and the election of Councilmen to serve for the ensuing year.

Upon motion of Mr. W. R. Cole, seconded by Mr. Vernon Tupper, and unanimously adopted, Mr. Chas. S. Martin was elected Senior Warden and Mr. W. H. Lambeth elected as Junior Warden.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, the election of a Secretary was postponed until the meeting of the Vestry on Monday evening Feb. 4th, 1924.

Upon motion of Mr. Cole, seconded by Mr. Brandau, and unanimously adopted, Mr. Douglas M. Wright was elected Treasurer.

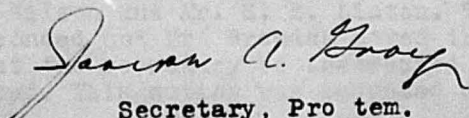
Upon motion duly seconded and unanimously adopted, the following were elected Councilmen, to wit:

Nashville, Tenn. February 4th 1924.

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council was held in the Parish House. The following were present; The Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Wheeler, Hunt, Malone, Tupper, Brandau, Wright and Mitchell of the Vestry and Messrs. Lander, Castner, Le Sueur, Linton and George Mitchell of the Council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the rector.

The first order of business was the completion of the organization by the election of a secretary. Chas. Mitchell was elected to this position.

The treasurer's report was read by Mr. Wright.

The Rector made his monthly report and called attention to the following matters:-

Assistant Minister:- Owing to illness Mr. Montague who was under consideration had found it impossible to accept. Mr. Wright who was looking after the work at St. Andrews was no longer in <sup>after</sup> the employ of the parish and St. Andrews would be cared for by a <sup>3/1</sup> lay reader

Proposed reorganization of women:-

Easter Offering:- Through the Senior Warden the parish had pledged \$9000.00 for the work of the church in the diocese. <sup>change</sup> The Rector thought that steps should ~~should~~ be taken to raise at least \$3500.00 of this amount through the Easter Offering. Mr. Tupper moved that the Rector be authorized to appoint a committee to assist in this matter. Seconded and carried. The Rector appointed Messrs. Martin, Vernon Tupper, Cole and Crandall.

Missionary Representative. - The Rector thought that the Missionary Board in New York should assign some specific missionary to be known as the Missionary representative of this parish for whom Christ Church would be responsible.

Installation of windows in Chapel:- The Rector suggested the installation of windows in the arches opening into the church so as to avoid heating the entire church when week day services were to be held. The matter was referred to the chairman of the church property committee. <sup>for further info</sup>

Parish Records. - The Rector reported that the Parish records were now being carefully gone over by Mrs. Starr and Mrs. Gibson.

Representatives on the Advisory Board of St. Luke's Community House. - Christ Church is entitled to two representatives on this board. At the Rector's request the secretary took the chair and the Rector nominated Dr. Wilson and Mr. S. E. Linton. These nominations were properly seconded and Mr. Brandau moved that the nominations be closed and that the secretary be instructed to cast the vote for the men named. This motion was seconded and the secretary so acted.

New Business.

Mr. Wright reported that \$700.00 of the \$2000.00 bequest made by Mrs. Leslie Warner to Christ Church Parish had been paid.

Mr. Vernon Tupper suggested that a committee to be designated as the Newcomer's Committee be organized. The Rector reported that this work was being voluntarily done by Mr. Brandau and suggested that for the present the ushers assist Mr. Brandau.

The Rector suggested ~~that in the men's clerk~~ the advisability of the organization of a Personal Worker's Committee whose duties should be to bring men to confirmation and to regular attendance upon the church's services.

There being no further business, upon motion, duly seconded, the meeting adjourned.

Nashville, Tenn. March 3, 1924.

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council was held in the Parish House.

The Following were present; The Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Martin, Vernon Tupper, Hunt, Wright, Gray, Malone, Mitchell and Dr. Wilson of the Vestry and Messrs. Castner, Hillman, Nelson, Mc Donald, Le Sueur, Stokes, Linton, Rogers and Geo. Mitchell.

The Meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector read his monthly communication calling attention to the following:-

- 1 - Satisfactory arrangements for office assistance had been made. Miss Juliette Charlton had been employed for half time at a salary of \$50.00 per month. This would allow Mrs. Watts to devote her mornings to the work of the treasurer at his office and her afternoons would be spent at the Church office.
- 2 - The Revd. J. F. Mc Cloud of Macon, Ga. had come to Nashville for a conference with the Rector and after same had been asked to accept the assistant rectorship at a salary of \$3000.00. Mr. Mc Cloud now had the matter under consideration.
- 3 - The schedule for Lenten Services had been arranged and the Rector requested that the Vestry and Council take the lead among the men of the parish in attending these services.
- 4 - The Men's Club had held its first meeting with over one hundred men in attendance. Committees were appointed and the club had begun to function. Much good was anticipated from this organization.
- 5 - The Young People's Service League is meeting regularly on Sunday evenings. A good deal of interest is manifested but they are handicapped by the smallness of the appropriation for their suppers and request that the appropriation be increased from five dollars per week to six dollars. The Rector recommended that that the request be granted.
- 6 - Consideration of an appropriation sufficient to pay the railroad fares of two students to the conference to be held at Sewanee. March 26-30. Miss Edith Roberts and Mr. Seawell Brandau had been selected to go.
- 7 - Proper sign for the Broadway side of the Church.

As Mr. Tupper had to leave early, so the Rector called on him to present a suggestion in regard to the Easter offering. Mr. Tupper read a letter which he had prepared to stimulate interest

in the Easter offering. The matter was fully discussed and it was the concensus of opinion that two letters would be more effective than one long one. No action was taken.

Reports of officers were called for.

Treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright. Mr. Wright called attention to the fact that expenditures at the present rate would exceed the budget. Mr. Martin moved that the Finance Committee be instructed to review the treasurer's report with the treasurer in comparison with the budget and report at the next meeting of the Vestry and Council. Seconded by Mr. Gray and carried.

Senior Warden. - Mr. Martin reported that he had had several conferences with the Rector especially in regard to the selection of an assistant minister and that he concurred in the Rector's recommendation.

New Business.

Student representatives to the Conference at Sewanee. Mr. Stokes moved that the vestry assume the amount necessary to defray the expenses of delegates from this parish. Seconded by Mr. Nelson and carried.

Sign for the Broadway front of the Church. Mr. Martin moved that the proper committee, after conferring with the Rector, provide the necessary sign. Seconded and carried.

Completion of the Church Tower. A full discussion was held on this subject. It was the concensus of opinion that a water color sketch of the Church, showing the tower, should be provided and place in the Church as a reminder to those contemplating bequests. Mr. Stokes moved that a committee of one be appointed to consult the original plans and ascertain from a draughtsman the cost involved. The Rector appointed Mr. Mc Donald.

Vacancy on the Council. As there was a vacancy on the Council, the vestry went into the election of someone to fill the position. Mr. William Dudley Gale was declared unanimously elected.

There being no further business, upon motion, duly seconded, the meeting adjourned.

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council of Christ Church Parish was held in the Parish House.

The following were present:- the Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Martin, Gray, Vernon Tupper, Mc Clelland, Wheeler, Hunt, Brandau, Crandall, Wright, Chas. Mitchell and Dr. Wilson of the Vestry and Messrs. Le Sueur, Castner, Lander, Rogers, Hillman, Nelson, and Andrews of the Council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector read his monthly communication.

The matter of an honorarium for the minister who would assist at the Easter services was discussed. Mr. Martin moved that the treasurer be instructed to give the gentleman a check for \$25.00. Seconded and carried.

The Rector reported that he had placed a church advertisement in the Student Year Book at Vanderbilt University, the cost involved being \$15.00, and asked that his action be approved. Mr. Brandau moved that this be done. Seconded and carried.

Mr. Tupper moved that the Vestry and Council endorse the formation of a Laymen's League as suggested by the Rector. Seconded and carried. The Rector appointed Messrs. Tupper, Linton and Chas. Mitchell. It was moved that the Rector's selection be approved. Seconded and carried.

The treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright. The treasurer called attention to the fact that 98 people had paid nothing on their pledges. It was moved by Mr. Martin that the matter be referred to the Finance Committee for action. Seconded and carried. The treasurer suggested the revision of the budget to conform with the receipts. Mr. Tupper moved that the matter be referred to the Finance Committee after Easter for detailed study and definite recommendation. Seconded and carried. Dr. Wilson thought that the women of the Parish should be appealed to to assume responsibility for paying for the rectory instead of going to the expense of putting a new floor in the church. He said that he was opposed to cutting the amount for which we are obligated to the Nation Wide Fund. Mr. Le Sueur suggested that the present floor in the church could be resurfaced at a cost of about \$600.00. Mr. Martin moved that representatives of the Finance Committee be requested to appear before the Womens Service League of the church and inform them of the present financial condition and invite their cooperation. Seconded and carried.

#### Communications.

A letter from Mr. D. M. Wright, Asst. Treasurer of The Bishop and Council calling attention to an attached letter from a special committee appointed to devise means of liquidating the deficit in the Assistant treasurer's office was read. The amount owing by

Christ Church Parish on the 1923 Nation Wide apportionment amounted to \$1947.05. Mr. Martin moved that the amount be paid, one fourth cash and the balance in three notes of three, six and nine months. Seconded and unanimously carried.

A letter from Mr. D. M. Wright, Asst. Treasurer, The Bishop and Council regarding an assessment against St. Andrew's Mission was read. The Rector referred the matter to Mr. Martin.

A letter from the Rt. Rev'd, Frank F. Johnson, bishop of Missouri was read. Bp. Johnson requested that a list of names of the communicants of the parish be furnished for the purpose of soliciting funds for the Bishop Tuttle Memorial. The Rector asked that the Finance Committee be instructed to furnish a list of 100 names. It was agreed that this be done.

A letter from Bishop Gailor, Prest. of the National Council, on Japanese Permanent Reconstruction Fund was read. It was moved that the matter be deferred. Seconded and carried.

A letter from The Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America soliciting funds was read. The secretary was instructed to answer to the effect that funds of the parish had been budgeted for the current year.

A letter from the Rev'd. Walter C. Whittaker, District Treasurer for the Province of Sewanee asking that Christ Church Parish assume a pro rata assessment of \$120.00 was read. It was moved by Mr. Rogers that matter be deferred until the next meeting. Seconded and carried.

The Rector announced that the choir had been requested to broadcast the cantata, The Seven Last Words, from the First Baptist Church station on Good Friday evening. The decision had been left to the choir and that he was pleased to announce that the members did not approve, instead the choir would broadcast Gounod's Gallia on next Thursday evening.

The following were present: the Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Cole, Martin, Brandau, McClelland, Hunt, Wright, Wheeler, Malone, Mitchell, Gray and Dr. Wilson. of the Vestry, and Messrs. Rogers, Castner, LeSueur, McDonald, Wharton and Dr. Haggard of the Council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Senior Warden, the Rector being delayed on account of dinner to students.

Mr. Chas. Mitchell was delayed in reaching the meeting and Mr. Gray was requested to act as Secretary.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Mr. Martin called attention to the fact that the real deficit of Christ Church Parish for 1923 Nationwide apportionments was about \$4,000.00 and the Committee to whom the matter was referred reduced the amount to \$1947.05

The Rector instead of presenting a written communication made a verbal statement, calling attention to the following matters.

Number of persons confirmed, being 27.  
The coming of Mr. McCloud as Associate Rector.  
Resignation of Mrs. Beard as Publicity writer.  
Expense covering incidental and unforeseen matters.  
Representatives of Christ Church Parish at the various summer conferences, especially the one at Sewanee to be held the latterpart of July.  
Japanese Reconstruction Fund.

Report of Senior Warden:

Mr. Martin as Chairman of the Finance Committee on readjustment of the budget, referred to the committee at last meeting, Report hereto attached, action postponed until Treasurer's report is heard.

The Treasurer's report as read by Mr. Wright is hereto attached.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried the report was received and ordered filed.

Finance Committee report again taken up.  
The Rector asked that the amount of \$600.00 appropriated to the Church School be increased and put under the head of



"Parochial Department of Religious Education".

Mr. Cole moved that the Treasurer be requested to keep the items as shown in the Budget under separate heads, seconded and carried.

Mr. Martin moved that the expense incurred in entertaining students at dinner in the Parish House this date be paid by the Treasurer, seconded and carried.

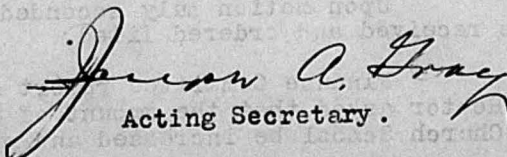

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council of Christ Church Parish was held in the Parish House.

The following were present: The Rector, Dr. E. P. Dan-bridge, the associate rector, Revd. J. F. Mc Cloud, Messrs. Martin, Wheeler, Vernon Tupper, Crandall, Mc Clelland, Hunt, Wright and Mitchell of the Vestry and Messrs. Mc Donald, Stokes, Lander, Nelson, Hillman and George Mitchell of the Council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The minutes of the previous meeting read and with a slight correction approved.

The Rector did not make a written report but instead made a verbal statement calling attention to the following matters:-

Mr. Mc Cloud had taken up his work as associate rector and that the work was being systematically arranged between them.

Mr. Mc Cloud would have his vacation in July and the Rector would leave on his vacation the second Sunday in August and return ~~the~~ the third Sunday in September.

The Rector announced that he was looking to the Vestry for help and counsel and that he would welcome any suggestions on the part of the members.

The Rector reported that he had been informed by the treasurer that the printing and publicity items in the budget had been overdrawn and that in view of this fact he had discontinued the publication of the weekly bulletin and had stopped the newspaper advertising.

The treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright. The Rector thanked the treasurer for the additional amount of work required in making the report so as to show the items as budgeted and the amount of the expenditures charged against them. Mr. Tupper moved that the report with the allocations be received and filed. Seconded and carried.

The Senior Warden reported that congregations were holding up very well notwithstanding the absence of the schools. He called attention to the fact that the commencement exercises of the Church School would be held on next Sunday and requested the attendance of the members of the Vestry and Council.

The matter of the continuance of Sunday evening services throughout the summer was discussed and it was agreed that they should be continued.

Reports of committees were called for.

Mr Chas. Nelson, treasurer of the Church School reported that the Rector had set a quota of \$500.00 for the school and that over

that the amount raised was over \$600.00.

Special Committee on Japanese Reconstruction Fund, Mr. Martin reported that a total of 62 subscriptions had been received, amounting to \$2084.95. Mr. Hillman moved that pledge cards be distributed to Vestry and Council and that further solicitation be entered into to raise the required amount. Seconded by Mr. Vernon Tupper. Vote tied and motion lost. Mr. McClelland moved that the matter be left in the hands of the committee. Seconded and carried. Mr. McDonald suggested that a portion of the congregation should be circularized by the committee. This being put in the form of a motion was seconded by Mr. Tupper and carried.

The Rector recommends that a check for \$100.00 be sent to Mr. Gentry who had been acting as Scout Master for the Christ Church troop and through whose influence the troop had been granted the use of the Vanderbilt gymnasium. The Rector offers this as a motion and Mr. Wright offered an amendment to the effect that the amount be charged to the Religious Education account. The Rector accepted the amendment. Seconded and carried.

The Rector announced that the Church School would be in session throughout the summer.

There being no further business, upon motion, duly seconded, the meeting adjourned.

The Regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council was held in the Parish House.

The following were present; the Rector, Dr. Dandridge, Messrs. Martin, Lambeth, Crandall, Gray, Mc Clelland, Hunt, Wright, Malone and Mitchell of the vestry and Messrs. Rogers, Hillman and Lander of the Council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector presented his monthly report which upon motion made, seconded and carried was adopted.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was heard. A motion was made, seconded and carried that the minutes be received.

The Senior Warden reported that he had been approached by a real estate dealer regarding the purchase of the church property. Mr. Martin moved that the Senior Warden be instructed to say to inquirers that the property was not for sale but should offers be made, no amount under \$500,000 would be considered. Seconded and carried.

The treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright. Discussion of the report was held and the matter of reducing the electric light bill was brought up. Mr. Martin moved that this be left to the chairman of the church property committee. Seconded and carried.

Reports of Committees were called for.

Religious Education Committee. Mr. Lambeth reported that the Church School Institute recently conducted had been well attended and that Christ Church had made a splendid showing. The Church School is greatly handicapped by lack of class rooms. Ten new classes are contemplated for fall. A canvass would be conducted in the fall to secure pupils. He recommended that partitions be added to divide the main assembly room and estimated that this could be done at a cost of about \$50.00.

The Vestry and Council received with regret the resignation of Mrs. Albert W. Shipp as head of the Primary Department of the Church School. Mr. Malone moved that Mrs. Shipp be thanked for her splendid services and that the secretary be instructed to write her to this effect. Seconded and unanimously carried.

Music Committee. Mr. Wright reported that the choir expense would be largely cut by reason of summer vacations.

Japanese Reconstruction Fund. Mr. Martin read a letter which had been sent to those who had not subscribed. Total received amounted to \$2536.95. Mr. Martin requested that the report be received and the committee discharged. An amendment was offered by the Rector that the phrase "with hearty thanks" be added. Seconded and carried.

TO THE VESTRY AND COUNCIL OF CHRIST CHURCH,  
NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE.

Gentlemen:

The following matters should be brought to your attention:

FIRST: The Church School is being continued during the summer - the special course of lessons being used. The result so far is gratifying, and I feel sure if this policy is continued, each year will see some real gain.

SECOND: The evening services are also being continued, and while the attendance is very small, it seems to be sufficient to give abundant justification for holding the services. This also should improve as people get the impression that the church does not close, and one after another falls into the habit of attending. Our gratitude is due the members of the choir who loyally and cheerfully accept the extra service thus placed on them.

THIRD: The work of trying to find the members of Christ Church and make a correct list of present communicants, continues. Week after week we have been occupied in making lists of those as yet not located; telephoning and writing letters in the effort to secure their addresses - writing letters to absent members of the congregation to ascertain whether they desire to keep their membership here or to transfer to some other congregation, and listing the information as it comes trickling in. There is much yet to be done, and it will probably be months before an approximately correct list is possible. I feel that this dull routine work of getting the records straight is vitally important. The Church must show her concern for the individual communicant, no matter where he or she may be.

FOURTH: Mr. McCloud has taken hold of the work with the quiet earnestness that is characteristic of him. I am sure he will not only be invaluable to the work of Christ Church, but that under his leadership St. Andrews will take on new life.

FIFTH: The interest which the Men's Club has taken in the boys at St. Luke's and the response to that interest shows conclusively that this very valuable work can be distinctly improved by the cooperation of the men with the women who have been laboring there so faithfully for so long a time.

SIXTH: The Superintendent of the Church School will report to you certain minor improvements which we want to make before the regular session opens in the fall - improvements made necessary by the enlargement and better grading of the school.

SEVENTH: Our thanks are due the Committee which had charge of raising the Japanese Reconstruction Fund. Their faithful and earnest labor produced results for which they may be grateful.

(July 14, 1924)

EIGHTH: The Woman's Auxiliary of the Parish has been reorganized in eight different Chapters, and I am optimistic of the result, believing that when these Chapters begin to function in the fall, it will mean the commencement of an interest and activity that will enlist a larger number of the women of the church in the service of the church as a whole.

NINTH: I have asked Bishop Maxon to give us an additional Confirmation in the fall and must rely upon members of the Vestry and Council individually to do their part by prayer and personal effort to bring men into the Communion of the Church. Each of us must know one or two men with whom he personally has some influence.

TENTH: My only definite recommendation as this time is, that the date of the regular meeting of the Vestry and Council be changed from the first to the second Monday in each month.

Nashville, Tenn, November 3rd, 1924.

The regular monthly meeting of the Vestry and Council was held in the Parish House.

The following were present:- The Rector, Dr. E. P. Dandridge, Messrs. Martin, Wheeler, Wright, Brandau, Malone, Gray, Crandall, Mc Clelland, Hunt, Vernon Tupper, Mitchell and Dr. Wilson of the Vestry, and Messrs. Rogers, Stokes, Castner, Hillman, Linton, Mc Donald, Lender, Geo. Mitchell and Dr. Haggard.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector announced that the meeting had been called a week earlier than usual for the purpose of discussing the budget and to arrange plans for raising the amount of money required.

Reports of officers were called for.

The Senior Warden presented Dr. Dandridge's letter announcing his decision to remain and asked that it be made a part of the minutes.

Treasurer. The treasurer's report as attached was read by Mr. Wright. It was moved that the report be received. Seconded and Carried.

Finance Committee. Mr. Martin. The proposed budget was read. Mr. Martin announced that the ladies of the Parish would hold a bazaar early in December and that the money derived from this source would be applied on the parish apportionment to missions.

At Mr. Mc Donald's suggestion the budget was taken up item by item and contrasted with expenditures for the nine months of the current year, each item being acted upon independently. Mr. Wright called attention to the fact that \$4300.00 of old notes were uncared for in the budget and stated that he thought the proper provision should be made for these. The Rector suggested that instead of the term, "Sinking Fund" there be substituted "Reduction of Debt". As there was no objection, this was done. Mr. Tupper moved that the budget be made \$44000.00 and that the Finance Committee be instructed to adjust the flexible items to that amount. Seconded by Mr. Mc Donald and carried. The budget was then thoroughly discussed and each item passed upon. Mr. Tupper then submitted a plan for raising the required amount. It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that Mr. Tupper be made general chairman of the Campaign.

Mr. Wright moved that resolutions commending the Bishop Coadjutor for his presentation of the needs and work of the Diocese be prepared and that the support of the Vestry and Council; be assured him. Seconded and carried.

There being no further business, upon motion, duly seconded, the meeting adjourned.

Martin, Vernon Tupper, Mc Clelland, Hunt, Wright, Wheeler, Malone, Brandan, Crandall and Mitchell. of the vestry and Messrs. Hillman, Nelson, Castner, Andrews, Mc Donald and Linton of the council.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rector.

The Rector read his monthly communication. The matter of the proper protection of the stained glass windows over the altar was discussed. Upon motion, duly seconded and carried this was referred to the Church Property Committee.

Reports of Officers were called for.

The Senior Warden, Mr. Martin, called attention to the need for a sounding board over the pulpit. The matter was discussed and it was referred to the Church Property Committee. Mr. Martin read a letter from the Chancellor of the Diocese in relation to legal status of the abutting property assessment, paving etc as applied to church property. Discussion was held but no action taken. Attention was called to the splendid work of the Nation Wide Campaign Committee and a vote of thanks was extended to the committee.

Owing to the Junior Warden's absence no report was heard.
