



GENTLEMEN OF THE VESTRY AND COUNCIL:

Since our last meeting we have suffered a severe loss in the death of our former Vestryman, Mr. B. Kirk Rankin. His passing takes from us not only a fine citizen and Churchman, but one on whom many individuals leaned heavily. I think it would be in order to send some expression of sympathy to his family.

Thanks to the diligent efforts of Mr. Seawell Brandau and his coworkers, a Corporate Communion for men and boys on the first Sunday in Advent was more largely attended than any other such service since I have been here. Following the service, a number of former members of the Junior Brotherhood met with Mr. Martin and his present group at breakfast in the parish house. It was a very happy occasion for all those taking part. Bishop Maxon was with us and insisted on having pictures both of Mr. Martin and of the group, for publication in "FORWARD IN TENNESSEE." In a short time, photographer was on hand and the pictures were taken. This was the more appropriate because Mr. Martin is now ~~ending~~ ^{celebrating} about fifty years of service as a Vestryman and as a leader of young men and boys, as well as approximately twenty-five years as Church Warden. I am sure that all rejoice in his continued youth and wish for him many more years of happy service.

Copy for the Christmas Bulletin is now in the hands of the printer. It is planned to mail this Bulletin, together with Christmas Offering Envelopes to each family and separate individual in the congregation about December 31st.

The special services of the Christmas season will be:

Our usual Christmas Gift Service, with offering of groceries for St. Luke's, and with a Pageant presented by the young people next Sunday afternoon, December 20th, at three o'clock.

Service of Carols and Hymns on Christmas Eve at 11:40, followed by Holy Communion just after midnight.

Holy Communion and Sermon on Christmas day at 11:00 A.M.

Christmas Cantata by the Choir on Sunday, Dec. 27th, at 5:00 P.M.

The other Sunday Services and Saints Day Services will be as usual.

Mr. McCloud and I are very anxious that those who are unable to come to the Church should not be deprived of the privilege of Holy Communion. We are therefore asking your cooperation and the cooperation of the whole congregation in arranging private Communion Services for all who are kept at home by illness or infirmity.

Notice came to me this morning that I had been elected a member of the National Council to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of the Rev. Dr. Milton, until the regular election by the General Convention next October. Acceptance of this will require my absence from the parish for several days in February, April and October, and will also demand time for additional work at home. For that reason I think it incumbent on me to consult with you before sending in my acceptance; but it is a work of such importance that I do not think it should be declined without serious reason.

There has come to me from Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick a very urgent appeal for help on behalf of expatriated German Christians. Dr. Fosdick's letter is attached and I think it should be read to you. I hope you will find it possible to designate the loose offering on some Sunday early in the year to this purpose.

Several other appeals have come to me in response to which I expect to make small gifts out of the discretionary funds already in my hands. There was placed in the offering on Thanksgiving Day an envelope addressed to me containing fifty dollars. This has been deposited in the bank and I have already drawn upon it to meet some urgent appeals.

We will hear with keen interest Mr. Tupper's report of the progress of the Every Member Canvass. As usual, many people have been away, or otherwise impossible to reach, so I think he will report the Canvass as not yet completed. In the light of his report, you will decide whether you want to attempt at this time any revision of the tentative budget already adopted.

At a recent wedding Mr. Thos. Joy put up lights to shine through the Chancel Window from the outside. The cost was small and the effect very pleasing. I asked him to leave them up for a little while, intending to bring ~~the~~ ~~matter~~ to your attention at the November meeting the question of making such illumination permanent. I forgot to bring it up. I suggest it now for your consideration.

Other matters on which we should take action this evening are:-

The definite designation of the object of the Christmas Offering.

The election of delegates to the Diocesan Convention.

The election of a member of the Vestry to serve on the Board of St. Luke's Community House.

The date of the Annual Congregational Meeting.




